The Beaver Colony is the youngest group within The Scout Association.

They age between 6 and 8 years

A Beaver Colony may be organised into smaller groups called Lodges.

Beaver Scouts will get a chance to try a wide range of different activities as well as going on trips, days out, and on sleepovers.

The Cubs are the next group within The Scout Association.

They age between 8 to 10½ years

The Cubs are organised into smaller groups called a Six lead by a Sixer and Seconder.

Cub Scouts will get a chance to Master new skills and try new things, have fun and go on adventures, make friends, are curious about the world around them, help others and make a difference, in their own communities and beyond

Scouts are a go-getting group of young people aged 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 14

The Scouts are organised into smaller groups called Patrols

Our scouts go on at least 6 camps per year and do activities from abseiling to zorbing. Every 3 years we go on an international camp to places like Luxembourg, Germany or Switzerland. We teach skills for life, like firelighting, cooking, teamwork and leadership. Why not join an adventure of a lifetime now!

Explorers are a group of young people aged 14 to 18. They make up the fourth section of the Scouts

Week in and week out, they gather in groups called Units to try new things, make new friends and conquer the small task of changing the world.

There are a range of badges available to Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and Explorers. These comprise of 7 challenge awards and lots of various Activity badges covering everything from First Aid ,DIY to Hikes Away and Camping

They are usually awarded when a child has completed a challenging yet achievable set of requirements. We aim to award for the taking part as opposed to meeting a set quality.



The top award for all sections is the Chief Scout award. To earn this a young person must:

Complete all the challenge awards. They are:

- My World Challenge Award
- My Skills Challenge Award
- My Outdoors Challenge Award
- My Adventure Challenge Award
- Teamwork Challenge Award
- Personal Challenge Award
- Complete 4 Activity or staged badges
